provinces, may lead. There are, befides what I have before mentioned, the love of eafe, the wearinefs of the war, and the preffure of diftreffes.

It is from fuch caufes, and in fuch fituations, that the moft fudden and unexpected revolutions have been brought about; no lefs than five or fix in Europe, and within little more than a century paft. Two moft remarkable in our own country, the reftoration of monarchy under Charles the Second, and the happy revolution of 1688. Nor were those of Portugal, Denmark, and now lately of Sweden lefs fudden, or entire. In all these cafes the change was eafy and initantaneous, almost like the fcenes of a drama.

In all it was a flying from prefent evils, from the uneafinefs and preffure of the moment, and in feveral a change apparently to a flate of lefs conflitutional liberty.
