and forbear to fish in all places, possessed by the other party; the most christian king's subjects shall not fish in the havens, bays, creeks, roads, coasts or places, which the united states hold, or shall hereafter hold; and in like manner the subjects, people and inhabitants of the united states shall not fish in the havens, bays, creeks, roads, coasts or places, which the most christian king possesses, or shall hereafter posses; and if any fhip or veffel should be found fishing contrary to the tenor of this treaty, the faid ship. or vessel with its lading, (proof being made thereof) shall be confiscated; it is however understood that the exclusion stipulated in the prefent article, shall take place only so long and so far as the most christian king or, the united states shall not in this respect have granted an exemption to some other nation.

ART. 10. The united states, their citizens and inhabitants, shall never disturb the subjects of the most christian king in the enjoyment and exercise of the right of sishing on the banks of Newfoundland, nor in the indefinite and exclusive right which belongs to them on that part of the coast of that island which
