T. P. 7 casks, all of very ordinary quality and

damaged.

D. P. 3 casks of the same quality as T. P. these 10 hogsheads are much inferior to the K. mark, and must have been the produce of inferior soil.

G. A. No. 19—part of this hhd. is very good and had it been properly cured and stemmed would have sold here at a good price.

L. G. G. No. 10-not quite so good as preceding

hogshead.

M. No. 10 cory ordinary and part damaged.

M. No. 11

HR. & Co.—part of this hhd. is very good for steinming, and part decayed for want of proper

curing.

"In short there is not a single hogshead in the parcel fit for home consumption, even 6 per cent would not compensate a manufacturer for the loss he would sustain from the bad condition of the Tobacco."
