

## SOFT COAL WILL NOW BE RELEASED

Fuel Commissioner Receives Pleasing Information From States.

Altho soft coal consigned to Canada has been held up at the border, H. A. Harrington, Ontario fuel administrator, has been advised that shipments will be permitted to come forward for industries on the priority list which are in immediate need. Mr. Harrington has received the following message from Washington in this connection: "The United States railroad administration has seized all coal on wheels which has been sidetracked pending distribution under priority schedule. The director of purchase of the United States railroad administration will have charge of the distribution. It is essential that you get absolute proof that the preferred industries are in immediate need of coal upon receipt of which information the administration will take up the advisability of immediate release to preferred industries according to priority list."

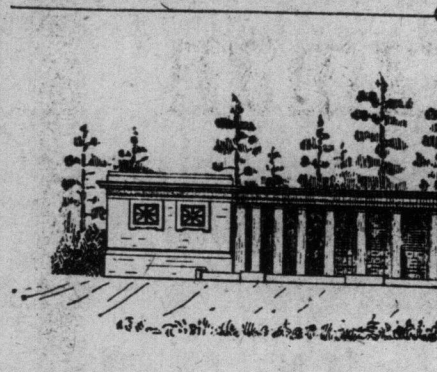

## MEMORIAL SITE DECIDED UPON

York County Committee Favor Design Shown in Illustration.

The York county soldiers' memorial committee met on Tuesday and decided on a site for the memorial and also examined several sketches of designs submitted by Toronto artists. The sketch published above is the one favored by the committee. This sketch is the work of W. Stanley Wickens of the E. A. James Company, Limited, and represents a structure of classical design. The main shaft is 100 feet in height and the semi-circular colonnade is 80 feet inside diameter, with space for a museum, a library and other rooms. It is proposed to locate the monument on the area between Bond Lake and Yonge street, which point is 800 feet higher than Lake Ontario, and quite central for the county. The memorial to York county fallen heroes will cost about \$75,000 if completed as Mr. Wickens has suggested. No definite action will be taken until the county council meets, three weeks hence.



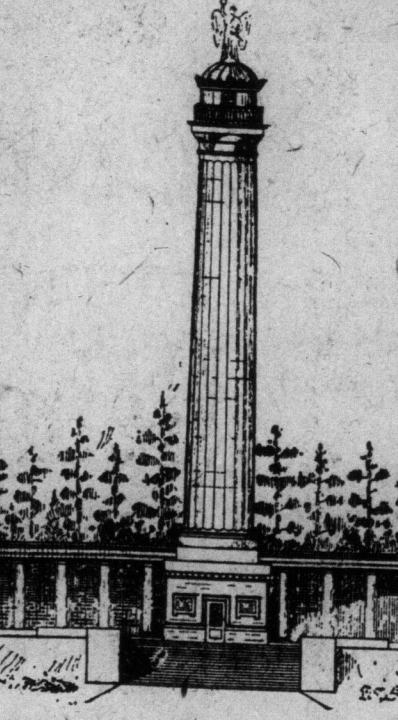
York County war memorial design passed by the committee from many plans submitted, would cost \$75,000 to execute.

## FOR EXTENSION OF T. & N. O. RAILWAY

Difficulties Compel Survey Party to Abandon Work This Season.

A survey party which set out last spring to find a route for the contemplated extension of the T. & N. O. from Cochrane to James Bay, has been compelled to abandon the work and return to North Bay in consequence of inability to secure proper help for packing supplies, the Indians engaged proving unsatisfactory. The party, it is reported, had covered about one hundred miles, which is half the distance to James Bay. J. Maher, the engineer in charge of the work, has hopes of completing the work next year, and in the meantime he will prepare and submit a report on what has been accomplished this season.

The survey party, Mr. Maher states, found a fairly good route over the first seventy-five miles, but beyond that the country was very largely muskeg and swamp. Railway building thru that district will be possible, but very difficult.

## BUILDERS WOULD BUILD FOR LESS

Says A. J. Stubbings Commenting on Housing Commission's Coxwell Plan.

In the recent criticisms appearing in the daily press concerning the Toronto Housing Commission raising the price of houses built on Coxwell avenue, Allan Ross, vice-president, is quoted as saying: "If any private builder had built houses of a similar kind they could be sold for from \$4500 to \$5000 apiece." "This is an utter absurdity," said A. J. Stubbings, vice-president of the "and appraisers' Association," being used as a cloak to command the people's confidence in their ability to continue building houses for sale.

Mr. Stubbings says that he can produce tenders for similarly built houses by reputable builders at considerably less price and in a more desirable location. "The commission should know by now," said Mr. Stubbings, "from the number of applicants who have turned their purchase proposal, that public opinion is dead against the housing commission's venture, and another scheme has to be devised to help out the housing shortage. There is one and one only workable and practical scheme and that is build houses for rent," declared Mr. Stubbings.
