

# MAY CALL FOR NEW PLANS OF OTTAWA BUILDINGS

Is One of Knotty Problems Which Hon. Mr. Pugsley Will Have to Face.

OTTAWA, Sept. 26.—(Special).—The minister of public works has a number of knotty problems to face in connection with the new departmental building which he has awarded none of the plans is regarded as sufficiently satisfactory to be carried out.

It will be a question, therefore, with the minister whether another competition open to the world shall be arranged for, or, following the example of the Government of Alberta, whether selected architects in different countries shall be invited to prepare plans, each being paid a stated sum for his work, or whether the departmental architects shall themselves prepare plans for the departmental building and palace of justice.

One of these methods must be adopted, and the responsibility of deciding which it shall be rest with Dr. Pugsley.

## CHINESE DISCHARGED.

Judge Winchester Thinks the Accusers Committed Perjury.

Hoy Jock and Hoy Jon, the two Chinamen whose trial for perjury has been going on in the sessions during the past few days, were honorably discharged by Judge Winchester yesterday, who expressed himself as entirely dissatisfied with the evidence of the accusers. He intimated that the crown attorney should look into the cases of the Chinamen who swore falsely during the trial.

Allan Lindsay pleaded guilty to stealing a horse from P. Griffin, and was allowed out on bail until the end of the sessions.

Jesse Reich, accused of perjury in the police court, was acquitted.

## IS THIS THE SECRET?

Deputy Minister of Labor and the Hostility to Orientals.

VANCOUVER, B.C., Sept. 26.—W. M. King, deputy minister of labor, after studying the oriental labor question here, makes the surprising announcement that orientals are not employed because they are cheap, but he declares they have superseded the whites in sawmills and like work because of their sobriety and efficiency.

He found some Chinese employed in sawmills at wages of four dollars a day.

## ELECTRICITY BY WIRELESS.

Wonderful Discovery is Credited to a French Inventor.

LYONS, France, Sept. 26.—The newspapers here today announced that a local inventor had discovered a method of transmitting electrical energy along distance by wireless telegraphy.

## BRIDGES ARE DELAYED.

Three big bridges at Watby, Wabie and Driftwood on the line of the T. & N. O. Railway, are delayed because the Canada Poultry Co. have failed to deliver the structural ironwork. A bridge 48 feet long at Watby, the material of which was signed for in February last, has not been delivered, and no definite reason can be secured from the foundry company.

Delivery was promised in July, on condition that an extension was given the company from June.

At a meeting of the exhibition board yesterday, it was resolved to recommend to the city council that the council should each appoint an engineer to consider and suggest what is best to be done to improve the street car connection with the exhibition grounds. It was also resolved that the period of the next exhibition should be from Saturday, Aug. 29, to Monday, Sept. 14, and that the opening should take place on Monday, Aug. 31. A letter was read from Hon. Josiah Quincy, Boston, Mass., expressing the pleasure he and H. M. Whitney had experienced on the occasion of their visit to the exhibition.

Architect Gouinlock made an inspection of the grand stand at the exhibition grounds to see if the recent windstorms had in any way affected the structure. Although the chairs had not been taken out, there were no signs of anything having occurred.

Mr. Gouinlock considers that the stand has now successfully withstood all the tests that could be asked of it, and in every respect has emerged triumphantly.

Numerous Changes Which Go Into Effect on Sunday.

## Why Grant is Asked.

Police Fund is Weak and Others Are Supported.

The committee of the police benefit fund management have asked the police commissioners to further their petition for a grant from the city council similar to the grant to the firemen's fund. The matter met with the favor of the board and has been passed on to the mayor.

The basis of the request is set out in a letter to the commissioners and is the increasing demand upon the fund and the dissatisfaction arising from delays in the granting of the fund.

It is set out that the grant ever received by the fund was \$10,000 in 1882.

As against this the firemen have been given \$10,000 to start.

An emergency call \$25,000 was added by the council and a like amount added by wireless telegraph, and lastly, a grant of \$7500 per annum for 10 years, or \$75,000 at 4 per cent.

The firemen pay only 5 per cent to support their fund, while the police assessment is 7 per cent.

The police membership, with claims against fund, is \$38, while the firemen membership only \$24.

The letter in no way criticises the position of the firemen's fund, but asks a like generosity.

It is also mentioned that the city contributes about \$7000 annually to superannuated school teachers who have been subject to no assessment.

## A City Hospital.

If the hospitals insist on the city paying 70 cents a day for city patients instead of 50 cents, as at present, "it simply means," according to Dr. Sheard, "that the city must establish a hospital to take care of the sick poor."

## Talks to Both Sides.

On board steamship Lusitania, Sept. 25 (10 p.m.), by wireless, via Cape Cod, at 10 o'clock to-night the Lusitania departed from New York, en route for Queenstown, Ireland, via St. John's, Newfoundland, and Liverpool, England. She is making 23.5 knots per hour. The weather is cloudy, wind easterly and light, and the sea heavy.

## QUEENSTOWN, Sept. 26.—The

Cinlar Line, steamer Lusitania, from New York, Sept. 24, communicated by wireless telegraph with Brown Head, seventy miles from here, at 3.55 p.m. to-day, when approximately 215 miles from Brown Head.

## Not Badly Crowded.

Dr. Sheard has taken a census of the district bounded by College, Simcoe, Bay and Front streets, the most congested in the city, and reports: Number of people 15,887, of whom 11,385 are adults and 4492 children. There are 2800 families and they live in 14,123 rooms. There are some large hotels in the district, and these, when the census was taken, had 1765 inmates.

Dr. Sheard thinks that the congestion is not so deplorable as described by the advocates of single tax and municipal tenement houses.

## Plumbers Keep No Records.

The case against Fred Armstrong of breach of the alien labor law was brought to-day. Yesterday Gordon Ritchie testified that the master plumber's section of the Employers' Association kept no records. He admitted having sent a couple of letters to the union plumbers and that the question of bringing foreign labor into Canada had been discussed, but nothing was done.

J. C. Merrick said he knew nothing of a bond for \$10,000 entered upon by six of the master plumbers, including Armstrong, for the importation of labor from the United States.
