Montreal Live Stock.

Montreal, March 28.—About 1000 head of cattle, 200 calves, 20 sheep and 5 spring lambs were, offered for sale at the cast-end abattoir to-day. Good beeves were in active demand, and about 40 extra Daster cattle were sold at from 5½c to 5½c per pound, and a few choice ones at 5½c per pound. Prime beeves sold at 4½c to 5c, good to medium at about 4½c, ordinary mediums at 3½c to 4c, and the common stock, at 2½c to 3½c per pound. A lot of 10 bulls, averaging over 1100 pounds, were sold at 4½c per pound. Calves sold at from \$1.75 to \$9 each. or from 2½c to 5c per pound. Spring lambs sold at \$3 to \$5 each. but they were not good. Fat hogs are higher; good lots sold at 5½c to near 5½c per pound.
