CRERAR'S AMENDMENT TO COLLECT
TAX AT SOURCE IS DEFEATED

Lemieux Resolution To Exempt Returned Soldiers From the Luxury Tax For Five Years Is Also Beaten by the Union Government—Race-Track Bill Passes.

OTTAWA, June 11.—The greater part of the afternoon and evening sessions of the House today were spent in consideration of the bill to amend the Income Tax Act, introduced by Mr. Crerar, to collect the tax at source. An amendment offered by Hon. Lemieux to exempt returned soldiers who had been overseas and their dependents from these taxes for five years was lost on division shortly before adjournment at the close of the afternoon sitting. Earlier in the afternoon the bill to amend the criminal code regarding racetrack gambling received a third reading. The bill, so amended, was passed by a vote of 104 to 77.

Shortly before midnight, when the luxury taxes were still under discussion, Hon. T. A. Crerar moved an amendment to have the taxes collected at the source instead of from the purchaser. The tax, so Mr. Crerar's amendment provided, shall be paid by the manufacturer or wholesaler at the time of sale, or on importations at the time of importation, in addition to duties of customs already imposed, and by the manufacturer or wholesaler to his majesty in accordance with such regulations as may be prescribed.

Inadequate and Clumsy. Hon. T. A. Crerar said the system of collection through the retailer would prove inadequate and clumsy. There was something like 2,500,000 retail sales in Canada daily, and if every merchant honest and true, it would have to be a huge staff in Ottawa to check 2,500,000 invoices.

During the discussion the Hon. Rudolph Lemieux presented a formal amendment from the tax for five-year soldiers with their dependents, who had seen active service. The amendment gave rise to considerable debate. Adoption of the amendment, the minister thought, would further open the way to fraud. The question would, however, receive consideration. The amendment was negatived on division.

The discussion was marked also by a lively passage at arms between the minister of finance and Dr. Clark of the Opposition. Dr. Clark declared he was at a loss to understand Dr. Clark's criticism, seeing that the proposals enforced the principle of direct taxation more than any other budget introduced in the House. And he spoke of the "silver-tongued orator from Red Deer" who preached so much about democracy from the highways and byways, having "bravely" and "manfully" trumpeted absolutism and autocracy.

Dr. Clark retorted that the fact of a tax being direct was not the only consideration. There was also the question of incidence and ease or difficulty of collection. The House adjourned at 12:15 a.m.

FLIPS WITH PARACHUTE
FROM SPEEDING PLANE

Sergeant Major Brothwell Performs Sensational Act While 2,000 Feet in Air.

ATLANTIC CITY, June 11.—A flip from an aeroplane while the ship was going at 110 miles an hour, 2,000 feet above the crowds at the Atlantic City Airport to test a new aerial life preserver, was the thrilling stunt performed here this afternoon by Sergeant Major Brothwell, crack balloon jumper from McCook Field, Dayton. The leap won him the first leg in the Aerial League of America trophy.

The feat was the first in the aerial safety device competitions in connection with the third Pan-American Aeronautical Congress in session here. The new parachute of the Irvin type, as attached to the back of the jumper, like a knapsack, release of the "umbrella" being secured by the pulling of the trigger rope across his chest. On his first leap Brothwell hopped from the wing close to the cockpit as the machine went into a steep climb. The chute opened in two seconds by the official records. He made a second trip with Lieut. Ray as pilot, and this time walked out to the end of the left wing and permitted the lieutenant to flip him into clear space. Three seconds later he was floating gently earthward, making a perfect landing.

PHILADELPHIA, June 11.—Five of the crew of Eagle Boat 25 were drowned today when the little war craft was struck by a squall in the Delaware River and turned turtle. Forty-six men escaped. The men killed were caught in the engine room. One man chiselled a hole in the side while the vessel was floating bottom upward and got out safely. A passing excursion steamer picked up the survivors and landed them at the Philadelphia navy yard.

JELICOE TELLS OF
VISIT TO DOMINIONS

LONDON, June 11.—(By Canadian Associated Press.)—Admiral Jellicoe, speaking as a guest at a dinner given by the Colonial Institute today said that as his report on his recent naval mission was still unpublished he could say nothing about it, but in regard to the impressions received he found in the dominions a great realization of the fact that sea power was all important to the British Empire, meaning not only a supreme navy, but also ability to make full use of the sea by the mercantile marine, both in war and in peace. The dominions appreciated these facts and showed a growing anxiety at the gradual diminishing strength of the mercantile marine.

CAPTURED GERMAN GUN
ARRIVES AT GUELPH

Home Course For Soldiers' Wives and Daughters at the O. A. C.

GUELPH, June 11.—A large German gun, weighing 5,000 pounds, captured by the Canadians in the late war, arrived in Guelph this morning, having been donated to the city by the militia department at Ottawa. It will be placed in front of the city hall until such time as a suitable place to locate it is decided upon.

HOME COURSE AT O. A. C.

The home branch of the Soldier Settlement Board is holding a short course at the Ontario Agricultural College for the wives and daughters of returned men who have settled on land in Ontario under the soldier settlement act.

INTEREST IN POULTRY.

At the conferences of judges and delegates from the various Ontario poultry associations held at the Ontario Agricultural College today good progress was reported for the past year. Some 70 or more poultry associations were represented and nearly all delegates reported an increase of members and a keen interest being taken in the meetings and shows. One feature of the reports was the greater prominence being given to "utility" or "bred to lay" classes in the shows.
