

## DAY IN THE LEGISLATURE TUBERCULOSIS DEBATE

Dr. Godfrey Commences Discussion  
Which Will Be Resumed  
on Friday.

Premier Whitney stated in the legislature yesterday afternoon that it seemed desirable to take up the motion of the member for West York (Dr. Godfrey) and that along with it would be considered the bill introduced by Mr. Downey respecting county boards of health and to prevent the spread of pulmonary tuberculosis. The debate would be adjourned till Friday and he hoped that members interested would be present in it.

Dr. Godfrey began by stating that about 3000 deaths a year occurred in Ontario from consumption, or 30,000 in the last ten years. Comparing the financial statistics of the state of Wisconsin, whose population was similar to that of Ontario, he argued that Ontario should make similar efforts to stay the plague. Other states had done much more than Ontario, and large sums were voted annually as well as in the form of intelligent, well-trained physicians.

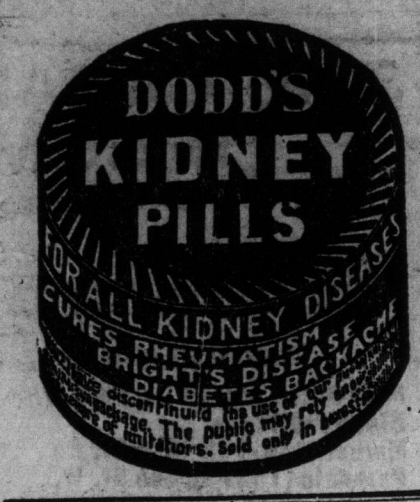

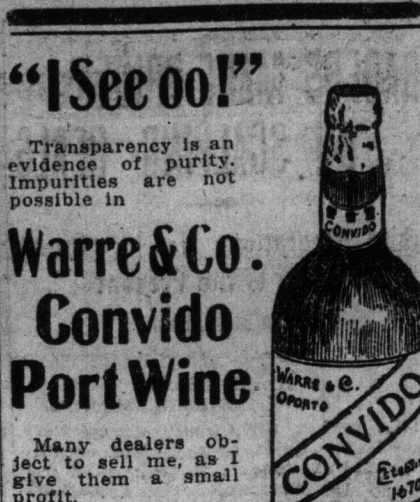
