Twenty-Three Players on the Job—Outfielder Hunter From Giants.

Columbus, Ga., March 16.—(Special.)—Four new players, three veterans of last year and another secured from the Giants by Larry Doyle, have come into the camp of the Leafs in the last twenty-four hours. Brandon are western hockey champions. They defeated Port Arthur, Thunder Bay champions, again last night at Winnipeg, the score being 11 to 7. Brandon are now ready to meet Varsity, O.H.A. and eastern champions, in the Allan Cup finals Saturday and Monday nights. HEAVY TAIL LEVIED ON QUEBEC RACING

Quebec, March 16.—The new license bill sponsored by Provincial Treasurer Mitchell provides for a tax of \$300 on film colorizing in Montreal. TWELVE TEAMS IN DAVIS CUP DRAW

Australasia or France Named to Play U.S. for Championship.

New York, March 16.—Canada's lawn tennis stars will meet those of Australasia in the first round of the competition for the Davis Cup. The draw was made today at the United States Lawn Tennis Association headquarters here. It results as follows:

First round—Spain v. British Isles; Canada v. Australasia; Japan v. Philippines; Czechoslovakia v. Belgium. The four nations which draw byes will meet in the second round, as follows:

The draw, which was made in the presence of a large gathering of representatives, former tennis champions and association officials, is considered an exceptionally well-balanced one. Under the present alignment it is expected that at least five or six of the preliminary matches will be played in the United States.

Tennis authorities who studied the draw almost unanimously agreed that Australasia and France were the logical nations to meet in the final round. The winner to face the cup-holding United States team at Forest Hills, N.Y., on Sept. 3.

In the first round, upper half, Spain and the British Isles will undoubtedly meet in Europe, while Australasia probably will come to America to meet Canada. In the lower half, Japan and Philippines will meet in the far east, if Japan players are ready to play in Japan.

Under the present alignment it is expected that at least five or six of the preliminary matches will be played in the United States. Belgium and Czechoslovakia probably will face each other in Europe. In the second round, Canada and Denmark, drawing byes, probably will meet in the United States, unless they defeat India and France, the byes of the lower half, are expected to play in France. The major portion of the second and third rounds and all of the semi-final and final rounds, appear certain to be features of the United States tennis season.

Among those who were present and took part in the drawing were: Mark Sheldon, Australian government commissioner; Gaston Flatau, French high commissioner; Robert D. Wrenn and Beate Wright, former U.S. tennis champions and Davis Cup players; Julius S. Myrdal, president U.S.L.T.A.; C. S. Landers and Chas. Chambers, president and vice-president of the Metropolitan Association, and Edward B. Moss and H. H. Hiley, representing the Tennis Writers' Association.
