


BIG C. P. R. EMPRESS IS LIKELY TO BREAK RECORD Buda

CZAR AND PRESIDENT OF NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

HAVE FRIENDLY TALK St. Petersburg, May 11-The hope of the establishment of friendly relations between the emperor and the national parliament was further strengthened today by the audience granted by Emperor Nicholas at Peterhoff to Professor Mouromtseff, the president of the lower house.

Professor Mouromtseff returned to St. Petersburg from the audience apparently much impressed by the emperor's earnest interest in the problems of the country.
