CANADA'S TRADE

Figures Show a Very Satisfactory Increase - Larger Imports, Larger Collections and Larger Exports.

(Montreal Witness). The trade of Canada continues to show satisfactory increases. For the month of September imports increased from \$27,060 for the corresponding month last year to \$28,397,478, while the duty collected increased from \$4,891,208 to \$5,082,731. For the twelve months ending September, the imports in 1906 amounted to \$253,257,885, in 1907 to \$296,330,543, and in 1908, \$301,456,097, while the duty collected amounted respectively to \$42,614,212, \$48,911,753, and \$58,661,096. This is a good sign of our prosperity and purchasing power. The domestic exports for September also showed a satisfactory increase, being \$25,703,886, as compared with \$21,337,015 for September, 1906, while for the twelve months ending September, 1908, they were \$187,315,429; for 1906, \$244,796,391, and for this year, \$244,180,922, showing so far a slight decline this year, as compared with last year, on account, no doubt, for the most part, of the slower movement of wheat this fall. The exports of manufactures increased appreciably both for the month and the year, and the aggregate over-sea trade of the country has increased from \$73,703,517 for the twelve months ending September, 1906, to \$64,731,701. This includes exports of foreign produce, and imports and exports of coin and bullion. Our domestic exports to Great Britain amounted to \$128,805,885, and to the United States to \$89,481,440 for the twelve months ending September, last year; while imports from Great Britain amounted to \$71,850,246, and from the United States to \$109,947,351, and from all other countries together, \$36,208,943 dutiable, and \$10,942,329 free. These figures are especially interesting in comparison and valuable to reflect upon.
