CAPTAIN BERNIER

BACK FROM ARCTIC

Only Casualty Was Loss of a German—Knew Nothing of War Until Spring—Sailed in July 1914

Quebec, Sept. 29.—Capt. Joseph Bernier, Canadian Arctic explorer, has arrived here on his vessel, the Guide, after a successful trip to the new land he discovered in the north, known as Baffin Island, and which in 1914 will be recognized as a Canadian possession. This newly-discovered land, which is located in the Arctic archipelago, about 20,000 miles from this port, comprises 200,000 acres of territory, as extensive as France and Italy combined. The only casualty reported by Capt. Bernier on his arrival here was the loss of one of his crew, a German, who, while taking photos on the island, wandered too far away from the Eskimo settlement and was lost. His frozen body was found thirty days later, 180 miles from the station, by a search party sent out by Capt. Bernier. "It was only by mere luck," said the captain, "that the body was recovered, for had it not been for the wind clearing the snow from the form after the unfortunate man had been lying some time, we would never have recovered his body."

When Capt. Bernier and his crew got on the Guide, for the north, the war was not on, and men of all nationalities looked alike to the hardy Canadian explorer, who learned only last month of the stirring events of the time. It was July 4, 1914, that the party set sail from Quebec. Letters and newspapers received last month informed the captain that the powers of Europe were engaged in the biggest war in history. Up to then
