**LAST NIGHT'S WAR CABLES**

More News of Kitchener's Journey to East

**Russians Pressing the Enemy—British Authorities Suppress a London Newspaper—Recruiting Success Gives Kitchener Chance to Deal With Other Matters**

London, Nov. 8.—M. Skotlandia leads the new Greek government. All the Zaimis ministers except Zaimis are members. This resumes the Allies' hope of aid from Greece for the present.

Lord Kitchener's visit to the Near East is made possible by the success of recruiting at home. He will go to the Balkans and also likely to Egypt, Mesopotamia and the Dardanelles.

The authorities have ordered the plant of the London Globe because of its attacks on public men.

The Russians continue to press the Germans and have penetrated their lines in the region of Lake Sventon. The Italians continue their offensive, but on the west there are only local engagements.

In Serbia big battles are in progress. The French are reported to have crossed the Bulgarian frontier. The Montenegrins claim successes against the Austrians.
