

LARGE PURCHASE OF TIMBER LAND IN PROVINCE

490 Square Miles Bought by International Co. Above Campbellton

The Times-Star was officially informed last night that the Canadian International Paper Company had purchased timber lands aggregating 490 square miles from the Chaleur Bay Mills Company.

These woodlands are on the Restigouche River above Campbellton, and will form a reserve for the newspaper paper mill which the International Paper Company intends to build in the vicinity. The paper mill will be built and operated by the International Paper Company and will use power from Grand Falls. Through its subsidiary, the Saint John River Power Company, the International Paper Company commenced work August 10 on the construction of its hydro-electric plant at Grand Falls.

During the last month or so there have been rumors of deals in timber lands in the northern part of the province and of projected newspaper mills in the vicinity of Campbellton. With the announcement by the Times-Star, the rumors are set at rest.

Nelson-Reicker

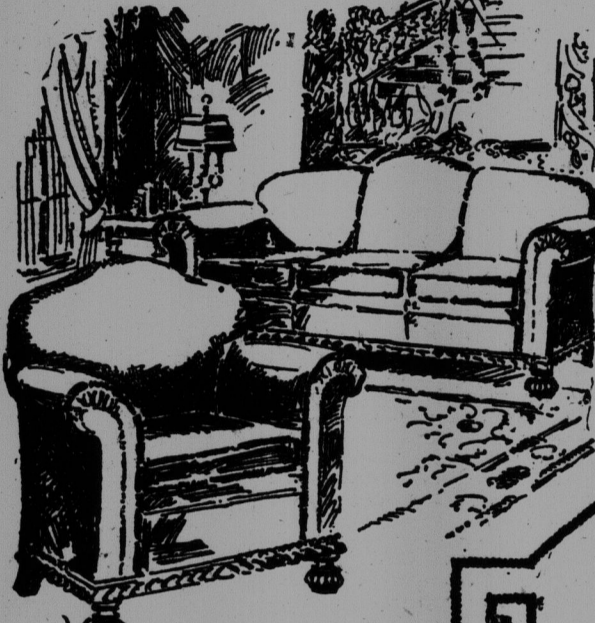
