





YESTERDAY AT OTTAWA. Ottawa, April 7-In the house of ommons yesterday, Adolphe Stein, elected by acclamation for Kamouraska,

took his seat. Third reading was given to a bill providing for settlement of differences between the dominion and the province of British Columbia regard-ing Indian lands. An act for carrying into effect treaty of peace between Canada and Bulgaria was given first reading. Second reading was given to the food and drugs act, and progress made on it in committee.

A bill to amend the Canada shipping

act was given second reading and put through committee stages. A bill to confirm an agreement between the government and the city of Ottawa was given second reading and reported out of committee.
