RESTRICTIONS FROM ALL RAW MATERIALS

London, March 12.—The board of trade announces that heretofore all raw materials may be imported without license. The list of articles included under this order comprises hides, timber, sugar cane and tallow.

The fall 1919 season, it would appear that instead of having lower costs, prices have already advanced so that today raw materials cost more than when the armistice was signed.

In normal times we import 98 per cent of the goods, 65 per cent of the hides and 40 per cent of the hides consumed in this country. In order that all available shipping facilities might be diverted to winning the war, imports by this country were greatly curtailed to an extent which would represent 50 per cent. As a result we have been living off "our fat" and raw stocks in this country are depleted. The maximum prices set up by the government are off the prices of raw stock have advanced from 5 per cent to 25 per cent.
