Machinery Market

In its summary of the iron, steel, metal and machinery markets for the week ended May 15, Canadian Machinery and Manufacturing News, Toronto, makes the following comment:

Dealers selling woodworking machinery are having a good season. This holds good, from inquiry made from several of the leading Canadian houses. In fact, this line of business is having a better time of it just now than the metal working end. Some of the concerns that have been in the process of tooling up with the purpose of turning to new lines, have been tied up for some days now in these operations, and are simply waiting a turn in events before they can proceed.

The work of making adjustments for the cancellation of war contracts is proceeding more rapidly now, and some claims have been settled although there are a number of others to be dealt with yet.

Canadian dealers in steel, including plates, structural shapes, etc., are watching with considerable interest the developments that have been taking place in the United States in regard to returning to an open market. The resignation of the Industrial Board, and the announcement that the fixing of prices has not the approval of the Department of Justice, leaves the steel makers with no medium for the establishment of lower prices. Hence all that is left is to maintain present values or face the alternative of bringing in an open market.

Canadian orders that are going across the line to the U. S. steel mills are, in many cases, accompanied by a stipulation that should there be a change in prices by the time the order is filled, the buyer here shall get the benefit of the change. This especially refers to any orders that will not be filled for three or four months yet.

Scrap yards have had a poor season of it. In fact, since the signing of the armistice there has been nothing worth while in the business, and some of the dealers with large overhead expenses have probably lost money.

Among distinguished civilian passengers who came over on the Olympic to Halifax yesterday were the Duchess of Devonshire, wife of the Governor-General of Canada; Lady Cavendish, daughter of the Duke of Devonshire; Hon. R. J. Caldwell, Marquis de Bugard, Sir Charles and Lady Gordon, Lord Huntington, Count and Countess Le M. Martineau and son from Paris, Brigadier-General Bell Smith and Sir St. Claire Thompson. The Olympic brought besides 5,300 troops, 200 first-class passengers and seven second cabin.

R. A. Franklin, president of the International Mercantile Marine Company, and Frank Thompson, director of the company, a multi-millionaire, were also aboard the liner.

Captain Robert Hannah of the 29th western battalion was the only Victoria Cross winner among the large number of soldiers.

ST. MARY'S BAND REORGANIZED

Last night the St. Mary's Band was reorganized at a meeting in St. Mary's school room. The St. Mary's Band became the 140th Battalion Band when that battalion was raised and when the 140th was broken up in England the band was transferred to the Princess Pats. They played at the wedding of Princess Patricia in London and returned with the famous Quebec unit. The instruments were presented to the battalion band by the Brunswick Chapter, I. O. O. E., and have been handed over by them to the reorganized St. Mary's Band.

The bandmaster is H. H. Williams, brother of the former bandmaster, C. H. Williams, who was killed in France.
