Eight Witnesses Stress Need for More Facilities at Charlottetown

PULLMAN AND MAIL CAR SERVICE ASKED

CHARLOTTETOWN, Aug. 8.—Development of the ports of Halifax and Saint John as a further aid to island shippers was strongly urged yesterday before the Royal Commission investigating the ills of the Maritime Provinces.

WITNESSES EXAMINED

They supported the general statements made in the brief on transportation presented by the Kinross, K. C., on behalf of the Associated Boards of Trade, and urged the construction of a mail and ferry, through pullman and mail car service between Sackville and Charlottetown, a second train service throughout the season of open navigation, and additional warehousing and shipping facilities at island ports.

Ensign Millard, who is in charge of the Salvation Army work at Stellarton, N.S., is in Moncton on her way to Saint John where she will spend a week or two.


