SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

Any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intended homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence up, and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader's wood stamming may pre-empt a quarter-section, homestead here a purchase. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate 50 acres.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may take a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.



BRIEFS FROM THE WIRES

The British Parliament has adjourned till Nov. 15. The accession declaration bill has received the royal assent. The insurgent forces in Nicaragua are reported to be marching on Granada.

Thomas Turner, a Hamilton coachman, committed suicide by drinking carbolic acid. The convention of the Volunteer Fishermen's Association of Ontario closed at Welland. Chaves, the French aviator, flying at Blackpool, Eng., attained a record height for monoplane.

Over 300 shots were exchanged in a battle between striking coal miners and deputy sheriffs at Irwin, Pa., yesterday. Three men were killed by an electric shock while at work on an Ontario Power Co.'s new tunnel at Niagara Falls.

The negro, Jackson, wanted for the murder of Jacob Enos at Chatham, has been arrested in Ohio on another charge of murder. The Empress of Britain has made the passage from London to New York in 86 hours, reducing her previous record 50 minutes.

A deputation from Campbellton was received by a number of cabinet ministers at Ottawa yesterday. A plea for Federal aid for the town. One Man In Jail Now. While Wilson has been identified by the man who was assaulted and thrown off the car when Dull was sent for, the majority of officials believe that he is an innocent party. He is being held, however. The body of Sheriff Dull, who died at the hospital here yesterday, was taken back to Monroe at noon in a private car for burial.

Two Men Injured at Hamilton. Hamilton, Aug. 4.—Late last night Chester Fickley, 315 West Hunter street, and Ramsay Willis, 25 Orchard hill, were struck by an automobile on the Dundas road and seriously injured. The two men were walking along just near the Globe Hotel, when the auto swooped down on them. Fickley was cut severely about the head, and had clothing torn from his shoulders to hips, and it is feared he is injured internally. Willis also had his clothes torn, and was thrown heavily against a telegraph pole. The doctors claim a few of his ribs are broken. The auto did not stop, and, owing to the spot where the accident occurred being dark, the number could not be distinguished.
