The Quebec Harbour Commissioners, at their meeting this day, 14th April, 1896, acting as Pilotage Authority, call attention to the great necessity of a Gas Buoy being placed on the shoulder at the Bank of St. Thomas, Montmagny, where a wooden buoy has, for all times, been placed as a danger signal, there now being a spare Gas Buoy on hand in Quebec. The Commissioners urge its use at the place named.

The Commissioners also renew their application for a Light and Fog Signal at Barnaby Island, the importance thereof being great.
