## ROAD MAXIMS.

Don't put sods and mud from the ditches, or even the soft worn-out material cut off the shoulders, into the centre of the roadway. Such material should be carted away or threw on the far side of

A common earth road if kept smooth and dry will sustain a large amount of

Smooth roads wear longer than do rough ones, the roll of wheels over a mooth surface causes but little damage, hard lumps, loose stones, etc. that cause depressions.

The split log drag used on the roads when they are moist after rains, not too wet will fill up the ruts, keep the surface of the road smooth and preserve the

To keep a road in good condition, after it is made with the road machine, the king split log drag is the best of all highway appliances.

Good road experts are of the opinion that good roads increase the value of the farmer's land at least \$5.00 an acre. And the farmers get another advantage of good roads. In Germany where good roads are the rule, even in the lumber woods, the cost of hauling one ton one mile is 9 cents, while in the United States the cost is 25 cents on the average county roadway. 
