**WHAT IS AGORAPHOBIA?**  
Often persons who are compelled to concentrate their mental energies upon one given point, or possess an acutely intellectual brain which is wearied by the repetition and concentration extended over a lengthened time, become afflicted with a nervous loathing of the subject matter, as in the case of Lewis Morrison, who has played Mephisto in Faust over five thousand times in twenty years before retiring to his California property for a two years' rest. "It is not one of agoraphobia, which is simply an abhorrence of travel and reputation. It has been many patients. Some of its victims object to crossing from one side of the street to the other, while others have an insurmountable dread of going more than a few blocks away from their homes. Some dread to cross a puddle of water, others fear descending into a well beyond a certain depth, and still others have a fear of going high in a building or an elevator. Specialists say these persons are acutely intellectual and the victims of agoraphobia are more frequent than supposed. Lewis Morrison's long retirement made conjecture rife in New York, one individual alleging that it was due to the strain on Morrison's part to live up to the salary his press agent said he got. The smart man made a wrong guess, seeing that Morrison already possesses a handsome fortune, and is announced to appear at the Opera House on Sept. 22nd as Mephisto in a magnificent new spectacular version of "Faust."
