

GOOD ROADS CONVENTION ON TUESDAY

Find Arrangements for Dominion Meeting Have Been Made.

DELEGATES FROM ALL PROVINCES TO ATTEND

Many Important Matters to Come Before the Gathering—Trip Through Valley.

Halifax, N. B., May 8.—The arrangements for the holding of the eighth annual convention of the Canadian Good Roads Association at the Technical College have all been completed, and when the delegates assemble on Tuesday morning, it will be found that the executive and local committees have left no stone unturned in order that the first Dominion wide convention for improved highways held in the Maritime Provinces shall be a big success.

Special Pullman car parties are travelling from Toronto, Ottawa and Montreal, and will arrive in Halifax on Sunday night by the Canadian National Railway, reservations for the Halifax, Charlton, Queen and other hotels.

Several of the delegates will attend the annual meeting of the Nova Scotia Good Roads Association on Monday evening, and the convention proper will open Tuesday morning at nine o'clock with the registration of delegates and visitors.

The convention will take place at 10 o'clock, when Dr. E. M. Desnoyers, the president of the Canadian Good Roads Association, will deliver a brief address of welcome to the delegates, and call on the Hon. McCallum Grant, the Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia to open the proceedings.

The first business meeting will be held on Tuesday afternoon, with discussion on Federal aid, gravel, earth, play and sand roads and the bituminous treatment of highways, each subject being dealt with by an expert from Canada or the United States and open to free discussion by the delegates.
