**The Settlement of a Labor Difficulty.**

Lord Fitzwilliam owns and works ex-  
tensive collieries in Yorkshire. The col-  
liers, earning enough by working  
three days in the week to keep their  
families and procure unimpaired health  
the week, have been very troublesome,  
striking work on all sorts of pretences.  
The number of strikes in eighteen  
months was twenty-six, the chief cause  
of complaint being that their employer  
continued to employ a miner who had  
not only refused to subscribe to the Union,  
but had refused to sign the usual  
pledge of fidelity to the Union.

Lord Fitzwilliam said this was not only  
an attempt to steal a portion of the man's  
wages but to make the employer an ac-  
complice in the theft. He steadily ad-  
hered to his resolution to protect and  
employ the miner who refused to join  
the Union. His workmen, he said, were  
free to join what they liked and free to  
refrain from joining what they disliked,  
and the man must not be interfered  
with. The tyranny of associated work-

Copper in Charlotte.

This Province is rich in copper ore.

Prof. Bailey's report and other scientific  
documents, as well as practical invest-  
igation, show that many millions of dol-  
lars worth of copper exists at L'Etite,  
and it is the opinion of all who have ex-  
amined the ore that has been mined that  
it can be raised at a large profit. There  
are several mines, more or less develop-  
ed, in that region. Charlotte is destined  
to become as famous for its copper as  
Cumberland, N. S., is for its coal. At  
the News Room are a number of spec-  
imens taken from a mine belonging to  
Mr. J. G. Woodward, that has been re-  
cently opened, showing that the ore is  
exceedingly rich. There are eight or  
ten workable mines on this property, and  
it is required is capital for their de-  
velopment. Prof. F. B. Nichols re-  
ported on two mines, for a distance of  
sixteen hundred feet, estimating their  
product in ore at \$1,900,000, or in mat-  
te copper, \$10,378,750. He estimates  
that seven tons of the ore will make  
one ton of ore, which can be raised,  
dressed and put on board ship at a cost  
of only \$5, leaving a handsome profit.  
The capital required is not large.

**A VISIT TO CLIFTON.**

The Point Grounds of the Kennebecensis  
— Strawberry Fields—Flowering's  
Shipyard.

A reporter of THE TRIBUNE was met  
at Rothery's yesterday by Mr. R. E. Pud-  
dington, and by him conveyed up and  
across the Kennebecensis to Clifton, a  
beautiful drive of four miles along the  
river, during which the eye is constantly  
engaged noting the various objects of  
interest and ever changing and varying  
scenery. The pretty farms and white  
houses on the opposite side of the river,  
and the houses and gardens in Rothery's,  
are observed with interest. We pass  
Titus's shipyard and see his new ship, the  
Lady Dufferin, launched the day previous,  
and at anchor, getting a few last looks  
at the old ship, which is remarkably  
quick work, and it will be finished about  
October. The dimensions are, length  
of keel 188 ft., 38 ft. beam, and 23 ft.  
depth of hold. She will be classed A 1 for  
9 years in Bureau Veritas. The ship  
works round and connected with the  
river are equally interesting and well worthy  
of inspection. The mill, driven by a thirty-  
two foot over-arched wheel, is used entirely  
for sawing the lumber for the  
ships being built. While we were in the  
mill the workers were engaged sawing  
and turning trunnels. The trunnels are  
made from the heart of the hickmate,  
and are sawed into three equal square,  
and then put in another machine which  
turns them almost as quickly as a man  
can place them in. In connection with  
the yard there is also an oakum wateroom  
and a draughting loft. In this loft, on  
the smooth planed floor, the models are  
drawn full size, every timber and plank  
being marked. There are about seventy  
men at present employed by Messrs.  
Fleming and the yard. No more  
time being at our disposal we bade adieu  
to Clifton, crossed the ferry, and drove  
across to Rothery. Here we were most  
hospitably entertained by Mr. Puddington  
and his estimable lady until the arri-  
val of the train, which soon brought us  
to the city much pleased with the day's  
excursion.
