

SEPTEMBER 17TH, 1900.

At Mrs. Asa Gordon's suggestion, a vote was taken upon the question, "Shall the time before the morning sessions be devoted solely to the consecration services, Executive meetings coming after five o'clock?" The decision arrived at was that members of Executive would be too wearied at the close of the afternoon session to give important business a careful hearing, but that as far as possible, Executive meetings would be avoided.

SEPTEMBER 17TH, 1900

A proposal to eliminate entirely from Provincial Convention, all reports, substituting therefor brief addresses on the Departments by the head of each (with a view to improving the platform ability of our women) was sent the Sub-Executive. While realizing that no such change could be made for this Convention, a vote was taken resulting in a unanimous decision against such a step, it being considered that the present five minute allowance per Superintendent was as little as should be devoted to the year's work and suggestions for future effort; that if anyone chose to give orally, her suggestions there could be no objection, but that the summary, at least, of the year's accomplishments ought to be a very interesting part of Convention exercises.

SEPTEMBER 29TH, 1900.

As Mrs. Wheeler cannot act as Convenor of the Plan of Work Committee, on account of her removal from the Province, it was arranged by vote that Mrs. Acheson take her place.

OCTOBER 2ND, 1900.

Having been notified that Rev. D. M. Ramsay, B.D., of Ottawa, had been appointed to bear to the Provincial Union the greetings of the Provincial Lord's Day Alliance, it was arranged by vote that he be given fifteen minutes on the Tuesday afternoon programme.

OCTOBER 9TH, 1900.

Mrs. Bigelow wishing to be relieved of the convenership of the Resolution Committee, Mrs. McKee, of Barrie, was nominated by vote to take her place.
