Forty or fifty years ago it was a common thing to have a pay ball on Xmas Eve, and I well remember the first one that I ever attended. It was held on Xmas Eve of 1855 or 6, at the home of the late Miles Mc-Innes, where Mrs. E. Cole now lives.

For a month before it came off, it was the sole topic of conversation among the boys and girls of the place. Each of the young beaux was trying to make sure of a suitable lady partner for the affair, and all the old "wall flowers" were brushing out their curls and trying to look and act their best, so as to attract the attention of some country swain, and thus get a bid to the


