Dear Mr. King:-

We have just had a moderate order from Mr. Gundy for copies of THE SECRET OF HEROISM. We had not been advised that the stock was exhausted. About 400 copies remain on hand of the last edition, in addition to which there are about 75 of the special edition preferred by you. You may remember that we had a small lot bound in a slightly modified style. These copies have been set aside, marked "Author's edition". Should you at any time desire special copies and prefer these, it would be well to mention this in your order.

The correction you refer to might as well be sent us and the plate changed, so as to ensure the correction before requiring to reprint.

If we could but get a word from the President, it would be worth everything, but just how to use the intimation of his kind appreciation is a difficult matter.

I trust Col. McCook may not forget to speak to Mr. Carnegie regarding his promise of some time since. When Mr. Campbell's volume of Poems was issued, Mr. Carnegie took a first 500 of these, sending a portion to Scotland where we understood they were distributed to his Libraries, but the largest share being sent by us direct to Libraries in this country, in accordance with the list furnished by Mr. Carnegie. I judge it would be for this same purpose he would use THE SECRET OF HEROISM. Some little news item such as this, if consummated, would enable us to bring the book afresh to the notice of the public through the press.

Many thanks for the report sent which will no doubt be received by later post. I shall indeed be specially interested in the opium report, particularly as we are just contemplating the publication of a little volume dealing with the opium problem in China.
