


I have to acknowledge the receipt of the 30th instant, in which you request that the school be closed at the Lennox Island Indian Day School, and that one month be taken for the winter months and the other month in the summer.

In reply I beg to say that it is considered in the interests of the children that they should not be asked to attend during the warm weather, especially as the other Indian schools take their vacation during the summer. Mr. John A. McDonald, Indian Superintendent, has been informed accordingly and, if it meets with his approval, you may close the school on the 16th instant for one month and re-open it again on the 16th of August, next, and you may also close the school during the month of January, next.

I may say that you should have forwarded your request through the Indian Superintendent and before closing the school on the 16th instant you should consult him and obtain his approval and be guided in the matter by his decision.
