RACE OF OCEAN YACHTS

STARTED FROM NEW YORK FOR ENGLAND 3,000 MILES OFF.

Emperor William's Gold Cup, Valued At \$5,000, the Prize They Are Competing For—Some Data About This and Other Yacht Races Across the Ocean in the Past—The Kaiser's Interest.

that the ruler of Germany has given as a prize for the winner of the race is a splendid vessel of pure gold valued at \$5,000. The finish of the race will be off the Lizard lighthouse, on the south-eastern coast of England. The race now on promises to be the greatest of its kind ever sailed over the ocean from one continent to another. Three transatlantic sailing races have been held in the past—in 1866, 1870 and 1887—but only one of these was an international race. In the first race three yachts participated, in the others two. There are eleven entries in the race for the Kaiser's cup, and three nations are represented—Germany, England and the United States. It will be a struggle for supremacy between the yachtmanship of the respective nations. England will be represented by the Sunbeam, owned by Lord Brassey of the Royal Yacht squadron, and the Valhalla, owned by the Earl of Crawford, also of the Royal Yacht squadron. The first is a schooner and the second a full rigged ship. The Sunbeam has voyaged all over the world, and Lady Brassey has written a book about the journey. The Valhalla is a vessel of 1,500 tons and 237 feet in length. She is elegantly equipped and has participated in many contests.

She is owned by a syndicate of 200 German yachtsmen, headed by Herr Ballin, director general of the Hamburg-America line. Two years ago she beat the Kaiser's own yacht, the Meteor. The Hamburg was designed by the famous English builder, George L. Watson. The United States yachts entered are all well known for their speed and include the Atlantic, Apache, Utowana, Endymion, Albatross, Hildegarde, Thistle and Fleur-de-Lys. London's Underfed Children.

After an investigation of the question of the presence in elementary schools of large numbers of children who on account of being underfed are unable to derive proper benefits from the instructions, the Local Government Board has issued an order dealing therewith in the spirit of truly paternal Government.

The order instructs managers and teachers who find children coming to school inadequately fed immediately to notify the overseers of the poor, who will at once supply the requisite relief. This must never be in the form of money, but in the form of food.

An interesting feature of the order is the fact that complete discretion is vested in the overseers as to whether the relief shall be given as a loan or as poor relief in the ordinary sense. In either case the father will be informed and will have an opportunity to make the necessary provision himself.

If he fails to do this, and in the opinion of the overseers it is a case of neglect, their relief will be regarded as a compulsory loan which they will be able to recover in a County Court. If, however, the parent is considered a bona-fide poor person unable to bear the expense, the burden will fall on the rates, the parent not being discharged as is ordinarily the case on receipt of parish relief.

The relief is not continued more than a month on a single application. The Local Government Board suggests that if a second application be made on account of the same child within six months the parent is considered whether it is their duty to proceed against the father under the Vagrancy Act or the Prevention of Cruelty to Children Act.

MOTHER OF A GREAT HOUSE.

Dowager Duchess of Abercorn, Queen Victoria's Oldest Friend.

The Dowager Duchess of Abercorn (who was Louisa Jane Russell, daughter of the sixth Duke of Bedford), died recently of gastritis at Coates Castle, Sussex.

The Dowager Duchess of Abercorn, the "Mother of the Hamiltons," bore the same relation to the British peerage through her family connections as did Queen Victoria to the Royal families of Europe. At the coronation of King Edward and Queen Alexandra seven of her descendants of the third

and fourth generations acted as court pages. She was born July 8, 1812, and was consequently in her 92nd year.

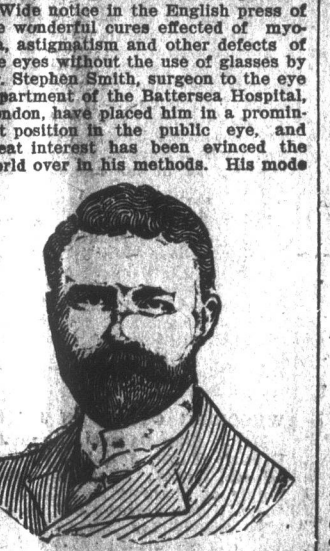
Last year on her birthday she received the congratulations of 146 of her 205 direct descendants, and she has seen her great-grandson, the infant son of Lord Douglas. She was married in 1832 to the first Duke of Abercorn, whose Irish estates at Newtown Stewart, County Tyrone, are among the finest in Ireland. She had 14 children, of whom 10 survive, the Marchioness of Lansdowne being one of the daughters. Among her 65 grandchildren are the Duke of Marlborough, the Duchess of Leeds, the Marchioness of Waterford, the Marquis of Hamilton, and the Earls of Durham, Dalkeith, Lichfield, and Kerry. She herself was a Russell, the second daughter of John, sixth Duke of Bedford, who was born in 1766.

The family gathering on her birthday was interesting occasions, as more than once the duchess' descendants assembled to offer their congratulations to the venerable lady, many traveling from distant parts of the globe to file before her, headed by her eldest daughter, the Dowager Duchess of Lichfield, with 13 children and 13 grandchildren, followed by the 13 children and 15 grandchildren of the late Countess of Durham. The duchess was regarded with great affection, not only in her own family, but in the wide spreading circle beyond it, and she continued to the last to enjoy her alert and active qualities, which were enhanced by her powers of bright conversation.

Coates Castle, near Petworth, Sussex, is the dowager house belonging to the Duchess of Abercorn, and is a pretty place, where the duchess has chiefly lived since the death of her husband in 1887.

London's Famous Eye Surgeon.

Wide notice in the English press of the wonderful cures effected of myopia, astigmatism and other defects of the eyes without the use of glasses by Dr. Stephen Smith, surgeon to the eye department of the Battersea Hospital, London, have placed him in a prominent position in the public eye, and great interest has been evinced the world over in his methods. His mode

of curing errors of refraction consists in manipulation and directly applied pressure on the affected portion of the eye structure. Describing his methods, he said recently:

"My treatment may be briefly described as a manipulation of the eye, the massage varying with the affection. Myopia is treated in one way, hypermetropia in another, while the various kinds of astigmatism require special means adequate to each. The process is so gentle and gradual that not the least pain, offense, and there is never the slightest injurious effect. The patient is treated only a few minutes daily. Some are cured in a few days. Occasionally there is no improvement for two weeks, and then amelioration is rapid.

Growth of the Hair.

It is a curious fact that a boy's hair grows one-half slower than a girl's. In boys the average rate of growth is three feet three inches in six years, being an average of .18 inch a day. During the 21st and 24th years a man's hair grows quicker than at any other period. It takes an eyelash 20 weeks to reach a length of .429 inch, and then its life is from 100 to 150 days. By means of a camera, the wink of an eyelid has been measured, and it was found that 20 winks can be made in four seconds.

Japan's Population.

The population of Japan totals at least 5,000,000 more than that of Great Britain. If you include Formosa and the other annexations the Japanese people numbered 46,500,000 six years ago, and they were then increasing by nearly 500,000 a year. Japan also has some very big towns. Tokio has a population of about 1,500,000. Osaka between 800,000 and 900,000, and there are about 30 others with a population of more than 50,000.

Charles Dickens' Mss.

With regard to the despatches which appeared the other day in the American papers, to the effect that J. Pierpont Morgan was making a sort of literary corner in the Mss. of Charles Dickens and was gradually acquiring possession of all of them, it may be just as well to state that this is quite impossible. For with the exception of the original Mss. of "Our Mutual Friend," all the original Mss. of Charles Dickens' novels are in the possession of the British Government and preserved in the South Kensington Museum in London, to which national institution they were bequeathed. The Mss. of "Our Mutual Friend" was owned by the late George W. Childs of Philadelphia, to whom the late Sir Philip Cunliffe-Owen offered on behalf of the English Government the sum of \$10,000, so as to complete the collection at South Kensington. But Mr. Childs could not make up his mind to part with the treasure, which either remains in the possession of his widow or else was bequeathed by him to one of the public institutions of Philadelphia. From this it will be seen that at the best Mr. Morgan might obtain some Mss. of a magazine article written by Charles Dickens.

Hong Kong First.

The importance of the Far East in the commerce of the world at the present time is strikingly illustrated by this statement, made by the United States bureau of statistics:

The port at which in 1903 was the largest vessel tonnage movement was Hong Kong. The total amount of the tonnage of the vessels entering and clearing from it was about 20,000,000, or, if Chinese junks engaged in the foreign trade be included, more than 21,000,000. London is second, with 13,000,000, followed closely by Antwerp. The tonnage of New York in 1904 was 13,000,000. Hong Kong, it may be remembered, is a free port at which many vessels engaged in the Chinese, Japanese and Australasian trade call. London would head the list but for the fact that often its vessels take part of their cargo from another British port, as Cardiff, and receive their foreign clearance at it.
