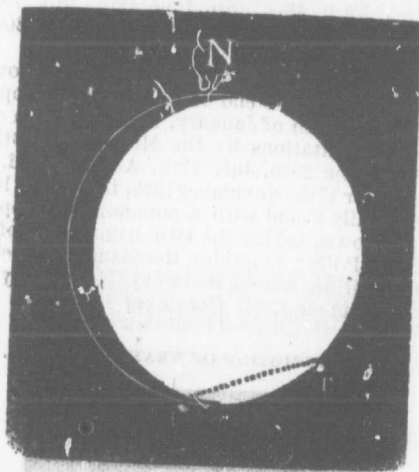


NEPTUNE. Motion direct till 24th July, retrograde to the end of the year. In conjunction with the Sun, April 8, in opposition, October 13.

An unusual number of occultations of the planets by the Moon occur during this year. Of these but one of Saturn, on the 10th of July will be favorable for observation at Charlottetown, the rest occurring either in the day time or when the Moon is below the horizon. On this occasion the planet will be seen to disappear at the eastern and darkened edge of the Moon at 8h. 2m. 57 sec., p. m., and reappear to the westward at the illumined edge at 8h. 31m. 26sec., after having been behind the Moon nearly half an hour.



The time of High Water is given for once in the 24 hours; the intervening tide being readily found by taking half the nominal interval between the two tides. The tides for the following places will be found by subtracting from Charlottetown time as follows:

Pinette, Bedeque, Pictou, Tatmagouche	-	0h. 45m.

Indian Rocks, Wood Islands	-	2 5
Cardigan River	-	2 5
St. Peter's	-	2 15
Malpeque	-	4 45
