COLERAINE. A village in Toronto Gore township, Peel County, 12 miles north-east of Brampton, the county seat and nearest bank location, and 2½ south-west of Kleinburg on the T G & B line O div C P Ry, the nearest railway point. Settled in 1830. It contains a Methodist church and a public school, and ships produce. Stages daily to Kleinburg, Castlemore, Gribbin and Tormore. Population, 200. Mail daily. Thomas St John, postmaster.

COLE'S CORNERS. A country post office in Sarnia township, Lambton County, 4 miles south-east of Sarnia, the county seat, and nearest railway and banking point. It contains a Methodist church and a public school, and ships cheese and produce. Population, 65. Mail tri-weekly. Wm Cole, postmaster.

COLGAN. A country post office in Tecumseth township, Simcoe County, 35 miles south of Barrie, the county seat, and 2½ west of Tottenham, on the N W line N & N W Rys, the nearest railway station. Nearest bank at Beeton, 5 miles north. Settled in 1821. It contains a Catholic church and a separate school, and ships leather and produce. Stage daily to Tottenham. Population, 120. Mail daily. COLINVILLE. A country post office in Moore township, Lambton County, 10 miles south-east of Sarnia, the county seat, and 4 north-west of Bridgen, on the St C br C div M C Ry, its nearest railway and banking point. Population, 200. Mail daily. John Butler, postmaster.

COLLINGWOOL. An incorporated town, 95 miles from Toronto, situated at the mouth of Pretty river (which supplies power) on the south shore of Nottawasaga Bay, Georgian Bay, and on the N line, and the terminus of the B & C br of the N & N W Rys, in Nottawasaga township, Simcoe County, 30 miles north-west of Barrie, the county seat. It has extensive dock accommodation, capable of receiving the largest vessels sailing on the lakes, is one of the prettiest towns in Ontario beautifully situated at the foot of the Blue Mountains. A fire in 1881, having swept away a considerable part of the business portion, it has been rebuilt with handsome brick edifices. The town has elevators, saw, flour and planing mills, knitting works, 2 foundries

and other manufactures and dry dock where ship on. It contains 10 churches, Catholic, Episcopal, Disc and Baptist, and 4 public pupils, a collegiate institute with a library of music hall seating 600, weekly newspapers, the *Bulletin*. Lumber, grain products of the manufacture. Assessed valuation of property, \$1,196,113.
