Examinations are held twice a year upon all the subjects taught in the different courses of the institution and summarized reports are sent to parents.

These examinations take place about the 25th of January and the 15th of June and last a week, respectively.

They are oral for the Lower Grades. In the Academic and Classical courses, they are written. In order to be able to take a more advanced class, each student must get at least an average of 50 out of a 100 on the whole, and no mark below 30 for a special branch of study.
