This, the first attempt of Eastern Ontario dairymen to hold a dairy exhibit in connection with their dairy exhibit in connection with their annual convention, was decidedly suc-cessful. The new venture met with the hearty approval of all, and from now on will be a regular feature of the annual meeting. A new depart-ure was made in judging also. Three experts, Geo, H. Barr, Chief of the Dairy Division, Ottawa, L. A. Zy-felt, of the Kingston Lairy Sacord and E. declared most satisfactory. "We were agreeably surprised at the quality of the cheese," said Mr. Barr in discussing the exhibits. "I had more trouble in distinguishing difference in flavor than at any other place I have ever judged. The cheese were most uniform; no one cheese stood out clear and distinct as is the usual thing.

"There were a few poor ones," continued Mr. Barr. "Probably five or six were off in flavor, some being turnipy and others 'cowy.' A better finish on the cheese, too, would have made a nicer exhibit. A lot of the boys can improve in this respect next There were a lot of loose capyear. cloths. A few were cracked on the ends, this a result of not enough pressing and cap-cloths not put on with warm water. There was not a dry, hard, acidy cheese in the lot. A

dry, hard, acidy cheese in the lot. A few were weak in body," ; Speaking of the butter, Mr. Barr said: "The flavor of the October but-ter was ordinary. The November but-ter was injured by the usual November dirt. But all in all it was a good, if small, exhibit."

The other judges expressed similar opinions, mentioning particularly the uniformity of make. "You would think," said Mr. Zufelt, "that many cheese had been made in the same vat in the same factory by the same man
