Bill presented in amendment of Act for registry of Decda Bill presented relating to Assessments Pawnbrokers'

Bill presented

Bir concerning and report to the figure upon, the fention of Enenezer Crowell and others, and thereupon presented to the House a Bill concerning Elections in the County of Shelburne; and the same was read a first time.

Mr. J. E. Morton, pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill in amendment of the several Acts, relating to the Registry of Deeds; and the same was read a first time.

Mr. J. Morton, pursuant to leave given, presented a Bill relating to assessments of

Poor and County rates, and the same was read a first time.

Mr. Murdoch reported from the Committe appointed last Session, to prepare, during the recess of the House, and bring in this Session, a Bill relative to Pawnbrokers, and thereupon presented to the House a Bill to regulate Pawnbrokers: and the same was read a first time.

Resolved, That the Bills be read a second time.

Committee of whole House on Bills

On motion the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the consideration of the several Bills which stood committed.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, Mr. Ruggles took the Chair, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

Bills to continue expiring Acts reported

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that they had gone through the Bill to continue the several Acts relating to the Light-House on Cranberry Island, near the entrance of the Gut of Canso; the Bill to continue the several Acts respecting the Liverpool Light-House; the Bill to continue an Act relating to the Court of Commissioners at Halifax; the Bill to confinue an Act, entitled, An Act in further addition to the Act relating to Wills, Legacies, and Executors, and for the settlement and distribution of the Estates of Intestates; the Bill to continue the Act respecting Aliens coming into the Province, or residing therein; the Bill to continue an Act for the Summary Trial of Actions, and the Act in amendment thereof; the Bill to continue the Acts now in force, relating to Trespasses; the Bill to continue the Act for the better preservation of the Property of the Inhabitants of the Town of Halilax, by providing for a sufficient Watch at Night; the Bill to continue the Act for the establishing a Bridewell or mouse of Correction, for the County of Halifax, and for providing a Police Office in said Town, with proper Officers to attend the same; the Bill to continue the Act to provide for the accommodation and billetting of His Majesty's Troops, or of the Militia, when on their march from one part of the Province to another; and the Bill to continue the Act in further amendment of an Act, to regulate the Jursidiction of the inferior Court of Common Pleas. within the County of Cape-Breton, and to fix and establish the times and places for holding of the said Interior Court and General Sessions of the Peace, in and for the said County; and that the Committee had directed him to report the said Bills severally to the House, without any amendment; and he afterwards delivered the Bills in at the Clerk's Table.

The Chairman also acquainted the House, that he was directed by the Committee, to move for leave to sit again, on the consideration of the several Bills to them referred: which the House agreed to

Ordered. That the Bills be engrossed.

Communication from Officers of Customsrelative to returns

Mr. Speaker communicated to the House, a Letter received by him from Mr. Secretary George, dated this day, transmitting, by command of His Excellency, for the information of the House, a copy of a Communication from the Principal Officers of His Majesty's Customs at Halifax, stating, that the Return and Account relative to the Custom-House Duties, requested by this House, in their Resolution of yesterday, were in a course of preparation, and would shortly be laid before the House.
