

WEDNESDAY, 7th FEBRUARY, 1798.

On motion, *Ordered*, That some Members be appointed to search the Journals of the Council as to their proceedings upon the bill “to provide for defraying the expence of the Public Service for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five and for disposing of the monies now in the Treasury”—and make report to this House.

Captain *Agnew* and Mr. *Campbell* are appointed for that purpose.

The said Members returned and reported that upon searching the said Journals they found the following entry—

“COUNCIL CHAMBER, Monday, 5th February, 1798.

“Read a bill from the Assembly, ‘to provide for defraying the expence of the Public Service for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, and for disposing of the monies now in the Treasury.’

“On motion of Mr. *Winslow*, resolved unanimously, that the further consideration of this bill be put off for three months.”

On motion, *Ordered*, That a Committee be appointed to prepare a draught of a Letter to His MAJESTY’S Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to be submitted to the House.

Mr. *Glenie*, Mr. *Robert Pagan*, and Captain *Agnew* are appointed for that purpose.

Mr. *Glenie* from the Committee appointed to prepare a draught of a Letter to His Grace the Duke of PORTLAND, Secretary of State for the Home Department, reported that the Committee had agreed to a draught thereof—which he read in his place, and then delivered in at the table; where the same was again read, and debated paragraph by paragraph.

And upon the question that the House do agree to the same—

A motion was made and seconded—that the several paragraphs of the said Letter, together with the different divisions of the House thereon, be inserted in the Journal—
