vince, in the room of the late Honorable John Saunders, deceased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province, bearing date the 29th day of September 1834, took his seat as President.

The President acquainted the House, that by a Mandamus under the Royal Sign Manual, dated the 20th day of August, 1833, Charles Jeffrey Peters, Esquire, the Attorney General, is appointed a Member of this House, and desires to be admitted.

ORDERED, That Mr. Peters and Mr. Botsford be a Committee to attend the At-

torney General, and see him qualified.

The President also acquainted the House, that by a Mandamus under the Royal Sign Manual, dated the 18th day of November, 1833, George H. Hazen, Esquire, is appointed a Member of this House, and desires to be admitted.

Ondered, That Mr. Peters and Mr. Botsford be a Committee to attend Mr.

Hazen, and see him qualified.

The President also acquainted the House, that by a Mandamus under the Royal Sign Manual, dated the 19th day of November, 1833, Thomas C. Lee, Esquire, is appointed a Member of this House, and desires to be admitted.

ORDERED, That Mr. Peters and Mr. Botsford be a Committee to attend Mr.

Lee, and see him qualified.

Mr. Peters, from the Committee appointed to attend the Attorney General and see him qualified, reported that they had, according to Order, attended the Attorney General, who took the Oaths in the presence of the Lieutenant Governor.

The Honorable the Attorney General was then introduced between Mr. Peters

and Mr. Botsford, and took his Seat.

Mr. Peters, from the Committee appointed to attend Mr. Hazen and see him qualified, reported that they had, according to Order, attended Mr. Hazen, who took the Oaths in the presence of the Lieutenant Governor.

The Honorable Mr. Hazen was then introduced between Mr. Peters and Mr.

Botsford, and took his Seat.

Mr. Peters, from the Committee appointed to attend Mr. Lee and see him qualified, reported that they had, according to Order, attended Mr. Lee, who took the Oaths in the presence of the Lieutenant Governor.

The Honorable Mr. Lee was then introduced between Mr. Peters and Botsford,

and took his Seat.

The House adjourned during pleasure.

After some time the House formed.

At 12 o'Clock His Excellency Major-General Sir Archibald Campbell, Baronet, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, Lieutenant Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Province, came to the Council Chamber.

His Honor the President of the Legislative Council commanded the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod to inform the Members of the Assembly, that it was His Excellency's
