in the case of a New York scalper. was charged with an infraction of the statute by selling a ticket from New York to Norfolk, when he was not a regular agent of the railway and the steamship companies which issued the ticket. The dictum of the court was that the provisions of the anti-scalping law had reference to the selling of a valid ticket issued by a transportation company. The question to be decided by the court was whether a legislature could declare such sales fraudulent. It was held that the business of a passenger ticket agent or broker had been a lawful one for years and the anti-scalpers law inter-

fered with the liberty of individuals in that business and was therefore unconstitutional.
