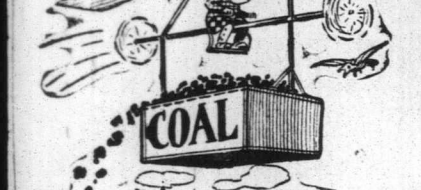

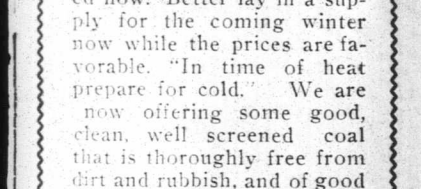

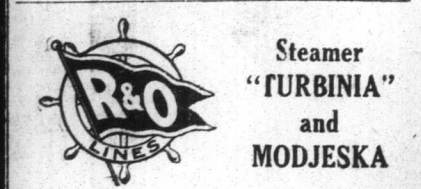

Mother Gives Poison To Two Children

One Child is Dead—She Takes Dose Herself and is in a Critical Condition—An Insane Woman's Act.

WILVERTON, Ont., July 24.—A tragedy took place in Wellesley township yesterday afternoon at the home of Mr. Thomas Crummer, a highly respected farmer living three miles east of Milbank, whereby his twenty-year-old son lies dead in his home, his wife hovers between life and death, with chances against recovery, and his youngest son, between one and two years of age, is in a dangerous condition, as the result of a dose of Paris green administered by the wife and mother.

Wealthy Young Viennese Was Induced to Part With \$115,000

LONDON, July 24.—A three-year term of penal servitude was imposed yesterday at the Old Bailey sessions on Arthur Newton, the lawyer who came into so much prominence during the trial of Dr. Crippen for murder. He was charged with conspiracy to defraud Dr. Hans Thorsch, a wealthy young citizen of Vienna, out of \$115,000 by false pretences in 1911 and 1912.

FARMER KILLED IN FALL FROM A BARN

Slipping From Roof, Robert McCullough is Fatally Injured.

MARYS, July 23.—Slipping off roof while shingling a barn on P. Roger farm, near Lothelby, in Fullerton Township, yesterday Robert McCullough, of the mill road, Blanshard, suffered a complex and arm and internal injuries from which he died a few days later. McCullough, who was 50 years of age, and son of the late McCullough, is survived by his four brothers and one sister.

Two Militants Are Arrested

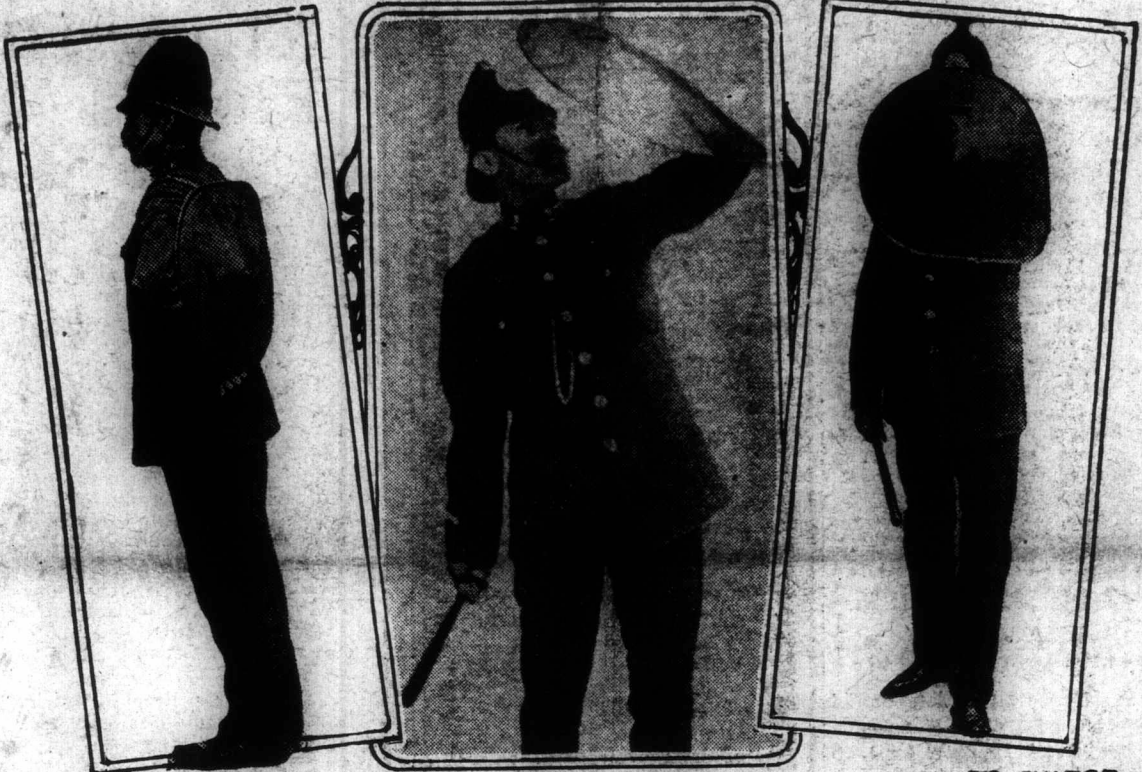
They Were Caught in the Act of Setting Fire to Mansion.

DONCASTER, Eng., July 24.—An attempt by a militant suffragette to assault Premier Asquith while he was on his way today to the town hall of Morley, Yorkshire, to receive the freedom of the city, was frustrated by the police.

BINGHAMTON, N. Y., July 24.—State and local authorities today began an investigation of the circumstances surrounding the fire of the Clothing Co., in which at least fifty persons, mostly women and girls, lost their lives. Representatives of the State Department of Labor, the state fire marshal, the state factory investigating committee and the committee of safety of New York, were present at today's inquest which is being conducted by the coroner.

Fatally Injured

WOODSTOCK, Ont., July 24.—Standing on top of a load of hay, H. G. Benfield, of East Zorra, a most prominent farmer, was yesterday thrown to the ground, when his wagon struck large stone. He landed on his shoulders and injured his spine. He was hurried to the hospital and there operated on, two pieces of bone being removed. His chance for recovery is feared to be slight.

BIG SQUADRON FOR WEST INDIES

NEW YORK, July 24.—According to a cable from England this morning, on the conclusion of the naval manoeuvres now in operation a powerful squadron of armored ships will leave for the West Indies to remain in those waters. The force will be based on Bermuda, the ships returning to England only in the summer in order to partake in the annual naval exercises.

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Pistol Shot Off in House of Commons

Came as an Interruption to Keir Hardie's Denunciation of McKenna's "Cat and Mouse" Legislation.

LONDON, July 24.—Another melodramatic suffragette interruption in the House of Commons occurred yesterday when a pistol containing only a percussion cap was fired by a youth in the strangers' gallery. Keir Hardie had just been denouncing the Home Secretary's administration of the "cat and mouse" bill and the police invasion of a private house to rearrest Mrs. Pankhurst. As soon as Mr. McKenna rose to reply there was a loud crack in the strangers' gallery. Immediately several detectives and attendants rushed to a youth who fired the pistol and hauled him bodily out of the gallery without ceremony.

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TORONTO ELOPERS HELD IN DETROIT

Two Married Women and Two Men Run Foul of Immigration Laws.

ONE HELD IN BIG BAIL

Parties Have Been in City a Year and a Fortnight Respectively.

DETROIT, July 24.—Samuel Collins, aged 48, was arrested this morning by Federal constables on a charge of breaking the Immigration Act. Collins, who is said to have a wife and three children in Toronto, is alleged to have brought Ebel Pepper, who has a husband in Toronto, to this city from Canada. They came here July 9, 1912.
