

Dominican Tobacco Orop. Dominican Tobacco Crop.

Owing to the high prices obtained for the 1917 crop a large acreage was planted for tobacco this year in the Dominican Republic, and it was expected the yield would total approximately 57,500,000 pounds, or double the average. Drought, however, has done so much damage it is now likely that the crop will not exceed 23,000,000 pounds. The greater part of the crop will be exported to France, Spain, Algiers and Holland. The amount remaining from the 1917 crop is about 12,420,000 pounds.
