Continued From Page One food—the nitrogen of the air. Once the ground has been inoculated with this bacteria they will remain there and do their work for years. It is claimed that this system can be put into practical and profitable use by the farmers.

into practical and profitable use by the farmers.

"I saw photographs which were taken of plants grown with the aid of the bacteria and others without it. The former, which had the benefit of the nitrogen, were five times the size of the latter.

"We were also shown the rapid methods of analyzing milk, which are put into practical use at the College, and we learned a good many things which were very beneficial to us. President Creelman, of the O. A. C., is the right man in the right place.
