Indictments against former Supreme Court Justice Edgar L. Furman and Charles F. Dodge were dismissed yesterday. Benjamin Ste. Subardt, Hummel's old law partner, who was under indictment, died Monday.

NEW LINE TO MUSKOKA.

Canada's Great railway, in building a line to connect Toronto with the main transcontinental track at Sudbury, has incidentally given us a new direct route to the Muskoka Lakes district, over which fast passenger trains will be running after Saturday, June 22nd. ORCHARD'S WIFE DECEIVED.

Haywood Helped Him With Fake Letters—Revenge Not Motive.

Boise, Idaho, June 19.—The murder trial of Harry Orchard for the execution of the Stuenenberg trial offered one of its most important pieces of evidence against William D. Haywood yesterday, when, recalling Harry Orchard for redirect examination, it introduced four letters tending to show that Haywood, during the fall of 1905, when Orchard swears he was engaged on various crimes for the federal leaders, had participated in a plan to deceive Mrs. Orchard of Cripple Creek as to the whereabouts of her husband.

ORCHARD AGAIN TAKES STAND.

Important Witness for Defence Dies Suddenly of Heart Trouble.

Boise, Idaho, June 19.—When the Stuenenberg murder trial is resumed to-day Harry Orchard will be called to the stand by the state. The defence will put a series of formal impeachment questions to him and then the prosecution will take him for his redirect examination. There are several points relative to the Stuenenberg murder and the alleged conspiracy behind it that were not developed last week, and these the state will bring out.
