Scorching Denunciation of Roblin Methods

Legal Technicality Shows 42 Illegally "YOU MAY HEAR OF SLUMP" ---Judge Had No Power Under Roblin Act
To Strike Them Off---Guilty Are Still in SAID HON. G. R. COLDWELL Government's Employ

Winnipeg, July 2.-Judge Dawson decided this morning to allow the 42 Italians fraudulently naturalized in Centre Winnipeg to go on the list. He had no other course, claiming that he could not go back to "damnifying methods" by which they were naturalized, but simply left the names on the list as he had no power under the Act to strike them off because of fraudulent naturalization. Some of these Italians have only been here a year, and nearly all cannot speak English.

Power the Culprit

Richard Power, assistant chief license inspector for Manitoba, is the organizer in Assiniboia for John T. Haig, the Roblin candidate Power is the man who handled the bogus Italian naturalization business recently exposed in the courts.

Pickersgill declared in court under eath that he protested against doing this as he knew it was wrong, but Power ordered him to go ahead as everything would be all right

These individual Italians in question, being called upon to give dence at the court of revision, testified one after the other that they had never appeared before a commissioner and taken the oath of allegiance and residence, as required by the Act. In some cases they had signed the papers, but without taking an oath, in the presence and at the solicitation of Frank Cancilla. In other cases, the men declared that they had nothing to do with the papers, and knew nothing about the matter until they were placed in their hands.
