## DR. McLEOD NOMINATED.

Conservative Convention Selects Rev. Dr. McLeod as the Candidate for the Approaching Bye-Election.

At the Liberal-Conservative Convention held on Wednesday afternoon after the nominating committee had reported and the officers had been elected, Mr. Geo. J. Colter, the newly elected president, took the chair and in doing so briefly addressed the Convention.

Coun. Archie McMullin moved, seconded by Coun. John Scott, the following resolution: That the Convention expresses its appreciation of the great service rendered by Dr. McLeod as the candidate of the Liberal-Conservative party in the last Federal election in this constituency to the cause of pure elections and political morality; and its admiration of the able, manly and energetic manner in which he conducted the campaign in opposition to the powerful influences that prevailed against him, resulting in what we regard as one of the most signal moral victories achieved by any candidate in the Dominion.

Coun. McMullin spoke to the resolution. He thought that Dr. McLeod and the Conservative party deserved credit for the manner in which they conducted the last campaign. The party made a record for itself, a record upon which they should not now go back upon. He hoped to see the election soon to be held contested. The resolution was unanimously adopted.

### The Protest Endorsed.

Mr. B. R. Burt, of Millville, moved the following resolution in a spirited address, seconded by Coun. John Scott:

Whereas, Dr. McLeod, the nominee of the Liberal-Conservative party in this constituency in the last Federal election, polled a large majority of the independent votes of the electorate, but was deprived of the seat, this fairly won, by gross bribery and corruption on the part of his opponents;

And whereas, at a largely attended meeting of party workers held in the city of Fredericton immediately after the said Election, in accordance with the announced purpose of Dr. McLeod at the outset and throughout the said campaign, a resolution was unanimously passed that a protest should be filed against the election of Mr. Gibson and a committee appointed with power to act in the matter;

And whereas the said committee in pursuance of the resolution did pursue the said election, with the result that the same has been declared void and the seat vacant and with the further result that there have been secured from leading members of the Liberal party in this county a written pledge that in all future elections in this constituency they will refrain from the use of illegal and corrupt methods and that they will use their influence to the utmost to prevent their party from using such methods;

Therefore resolved that this Convention heartily approves of and endorses the course taken by the said Committee, and is of the opinion that the same has been in line with the principles in regard to Party in Elections laid down by the Liberal-Conservative candidate and adopted by the Liberal-Conservative Convention in October last and in the best and truest interests of the Liberal-Conservative party and the country at large. This resolution was also passed unanimously.

### Appreciation of Rev. Dr. McLeod.

Major W. T. Howe moved, seconded by Mr. A. D. Thomas, the following resolution, which was unanimously adopted:

1. That this Convention records with great satisfaction the appreciation of the faithfulness with which the Liberal-Conservative party in the last federal election observed the conditions stipulated by Dr. McLeod in his acceptance of the nomination on the party, and of the unselfish and earnest efforts they made to purge the constituency of the corrupt election methods that have so long prevailed, degrading the political affairs of the country.

2. That this Convention re-affirm with emphasis the platform of principles enunciated by Dr. McLeod and adopted by the Convention of October, 1900; and that we hereby pledge the party to conduct all future elections on like principles, using every effort to the end that from a clean electorate there may come an untrammelled and independent judgment on public questions and choice of representatives.

3. That the Liberal-Conservative party, having successfully inaugurated a movement for the radical reform of the election methods, which threaten the very groundwork of our responsible institutions, we commend the movement to the electors of the whole Dominion, and urge that it be taken up and vigorously carried on in every electoral district to the uplifting and purifying of the national life.

### Dr. McLeod Nominated to Contest the Election.

Vice President Thomas took the chair for a few moments while President Colter addressed the Convention, and he concluded by nominating Rev. Dr. McLeod as the candidate for the Liberal-Conservative party of York County in the election to be held to fill the seat made vacant by the unseating of Mr. Alex. Gibson.

The nomination was seconded by Mr. L. H. Bliss, and was accepted by a standing vote and was unanimous.

### Dr. McLeod Accepts.

Dr. McLeod accepted the nomination in an address which was frequently interrupted by hearty applause. He said that last fall when the Conservatives assembled in convention wanted him that they had to send and bring him; but on the present occasion he came voluntarily. He had much reluctance in attending the present convention, but felt that it was due to the electors of York that he should attend and give them an account of his stewardship up to the present point. He had heard

many kind and generous things said of himself here to-day, and he was not used to hearing such things. He was more used to hearing hard things said of himself, but they did not hurt him and he had arrived at that point where he had learned to disregard them.

The people of the country districts have shown a hearty interest in the public affairs and political matters of the county in coming here at this busy season. He had absolutely no political ambitions, but he was placed in a peculiar position. He had put his hand to the plough and he was only wondering if he dared now turn back. If he accepted the nomination it must be and would be only on the same conditions he laid down at the Convention last October and which were so heartily adopted and strictly carried out by the Convention. The stand which York county has taken has met with hearty approval from all parts of the Dominion. He had received many letters of approval and congratulation from gentlemen from the Atlantic to the Pacific, and many of them from men whom he had never seen. He accepted the nomination and would devote his energies to bring about the deliverance of those who make franchises of men things of marketable traffic. Let all stand true for the things that are pure and right in political and national life and the Conservative party would score a more emphatic victory even than in the last election.

The Convention adjourned with singing God Save the King and cheers for His Majesty and for Dr. McLeod.

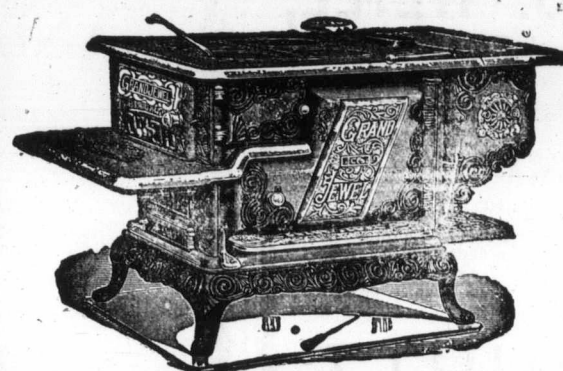
