St. John's Municipal Council.

PUBLIC NOTICE.

Theatrical, Musical, Etc., Tax
Amendment.

Whereas under Resolution of date 22nd of March, 1910, the Municipal Council fixed the rate to be paid by persons owning, operating or keeping for hire or profit any Theatrical, Musical, Dancing, Pictorial, Pantomime, Athletic, Circus or other kind of public performance or exhibition within the city limits at the rate of 4 per cent on the gross receipts of each performance so held;

And whereas at a Regular Meeting of the St. John's Municipal Council held September 8th, 1911, it was resolved that the said tax be reduced to 2½ per cent on the gross receipts of all such performances;

And whereas at a Regular Meeting of the Municipal Council held on the 27th day of February, 1914, it was resolved that the foregoing Resolutions be amended and the following rate fixed to be paid by all persons owning, operating or keeping for hire or profit any Theatrical, Musical, Dancing, Pictorial, Pantomime, Athletic, Circus, or other kind of public performance or exhibition within the city limits, at the rate of 2½ per cent on the gross proceeds of each performance so held, and that the said Resolution be published in the "Royal Gazette."

MODE OF COLLECTION:— Each morning succeeding the said performance or performances, the owners or proprietors thereof or their agents shall make a statement by way of affidavit, before the Secretary-Treasurer of the Council, setting forth the gross amount received at such performance or performances, and shall forthwith pay to the Secretary-Treasurer a sum equal to three and a half per cent on the gross receipts set forth in said affidavit.
