Our Debt to Our Gallant Seamen.

The submarine warfare by Germany against commerce with the British Isles, has now been waged for nearly twenty-one weeks, and Admiral Oscar von Trupprek, who was at one time German Governor of Kia Choo, in China, which was wrested from Germany by British and Japanese forces, raises the question in 'Der Tag' yesterday whether the value of this submarine warfare against British commerce is enough to justify its continuance in its present form at the expense of a rupture with the United States.
