

NAVAL ESCORT FOR PRINCE.

Race Riots in Chicago--Salvaging Sunken Ships at Scapa Flow--Britain's Huge Loan Over Subscribed--London Welcomes Foch.

BRINGING THE PRINCE.

LONDON, July 30. (Reuters Ottawa Agency)--The Admiralty has issued the program of His Majesty's ships Renown, Dragon and Bismarck for the visit of the Prince of Wales to Newfoundland and Canada. The Prince will embark on the Renown at Portsmouth on August 5 and transfer at sea to the Dragon on arrival in Canadian waters. He will disembark at St. John's on August 13 and transfer at sea to the Bismarck on arrival at Quebec after arrival on August 21.

THE CHICAGO RACE RIOTS.

CHICAGO, July 30. A conference of fifty negro ministers, professional men, social workers, and business men, after investigating the causes of the Chicago race riots, issued a report to-day calling upon Governor Lowden to detail State troops to the disturbed districts.

RECOVERING HUN FLEET.

LONDON, July 30. One battleship, three light cruisers and fifteen destroyers of the former German Grand Fleet, which was scuttled by their crews at Scapa Flow on June 22, are ready to be salvaged, it was announced to-day in the House of Commons by Walter Hume Long, First Lord of the Admiralty. Mr. Long said work was proceeding on other destroyers. He said there was no intention of holding a court of inquiry.

LOAN OVERSUBSCRIBED.

LONDON, July 30. The recent British Victory Loan amounted to £787,500,000. It was announced to-day in the House of Commons by J. Austin Chamberlain, Chancellor of the Exchequer. This exceeds the amount previously announced by £50,000,000.


REPORT DENIED.

LONDON, July 30. The assertion by Liberal papers that Sir Philip Kerr, Secretary to Premier Lloyd George, had given a memorandum to the effect that the Government would not support the League of Nations, was denied to-day.

the right to fight it out within reasonable limits. Never must force be employed in questions where private interest was the motive power. But the position which the Government was taking up had been accepted, viz., that where the State as a whole is challenged and where the life and welfare of the community as a whole are endangered then obviously the State must use all the resources at its disposal to fight without flinching to the bitter end.

GERMANS WARNED.

PARIS, July 30. Premier Clemenceau, as President of the Peace Conference, sent a letter to-day to the German peace delegation protesting against the action of Germans in selling national properties in Schleswig, in which a plebiscite is to be taken for decision by the population as to union with Denmark. The note gave warning to the Germans that the properties in question were considered as possible security for the payment of Germany's indemnity and that the peace conference would hold Germany responsible for the proceeds of such sales.

CANADIAN FINANCE.

OTTAWA, July 30. Sir Thomas White stated to-day that since September last credits to Great Britain aggregating \$167,000,000 had been furnished by the Government for the purchase of last year's wheat crop. In addition, about \$25,000,000 had been supplied for the purchase of other foodstuffs and over \$12,000,000 for timber.

PORTUGAL TO HAVE NEW PRESIDENT.

LONDON, July 30. The election of a President of the Portuguese Republic will take place on August 6th, it was announced to-day.

RELIGIOUS PERSECUTION IN RUSSIA.

OMASK, July 26. (Via Russian Wireless)--Religious persecution continues in Bolshevik Russia. Advice says that Moscow Adoniskovsk and Vsevolodsk monasteries are being used as barracks for Chinese and Lettish soldiers.

GRAND BLACK CHAPTER CLOSING.

OTTAWA, July 30. With the election of officers, the presentation of important reports and the adoption of a resolution of loyalty to the brethren in Ireland, the convention of the Grand Black Chapter of British America came to a close to-night. John Easton of Manitoba being re-elected Grand Master and J. W. Penney of Newfoundland, Deputy Grand Master. Neil Stewart, Nova Scotia, G. D. Wright, Prince Edward Island, George Langmead, Newfoundland, were among the lecturers elected.

AGREES TO PROCEDURE.

PARIS, July 30. Baron Kurt von Lerster, chief of the German peace delegation, has sent a letter to the Peace Conference accepting the procedure proposed by the Allies for transfer by Germany to Poland of the district attributed to Poland by the Peace Treaty.

RACE RIOTS IN CHICAGO.

CHICAGO, July 30. Rioting between whites and blacks continued long after midnight and hundreds were wounded. The Ninth and Tenth regiments of Illinois troops are reported on the way to Chicago and the increase in available soldiers is more than 57,000, but none have taken up patrol duty, the police officers refusing to concede defeat and ask military aid.

BELGIUM TO RATIFY TREATY.

BRUSSELS, July 30. The Foreign Affairs Committee of the Belgian Chamber of Deputies to-day passed favorably on the question of the ratifications of the Peace Treaty with Germany.

KING GEORGE RECEIVES MARSHAL FOCH.

LONDON, July 30. King George received Marshal Foch to-day at Buckingham Palace, and conferred the rank of Field Marshal of the British Army upon him.

TO DEPORT ALIENS.

WASHINGTON, July 30. A bill to deport undesirable aliens, under which the Government may send home enemy aliens now interned in this country, was passed to-day by the House.

REVOLUTIONISTS ACTIVE.

SAN SALVADOR, July 30. The town of Danli, close to the Nicaraguan frontier, has been captured by revolutionists in Honduras, according to dispatches published here to-day. In the fighting, Colonel Jacinto Velasquez, leader of the Gutierrez party, was killed.
