

DAYS' MESSAGES.

BOAT SEIZED.
PORTSMOUTH, Va., Feb. 26.
The schooner Emerald, of
the U.S. flying the British flag,
was seized by the coastguard cutter
off the south coast of
Virginia late yesterday.
The cargo, it is reported,
consisted of more than a
ton of liquor for New
York.

INDIA PROPAGANDA.
DELHI, India, Feb. 26.
The All India Congress Com-
mittee adopted a resolution placed be-
fore it by M. K. Gandhi, Nationalist

leader, providing for the association
of practically all non-co-operative ac-
tivities, except massed civil obedi-
ence. These activities include indivi-
dual civil disobedience and both de-
fensive and offensive picketing. It is
understood the resolution goes be-
yond Gandhi's personal views, being
drafted to satisfy other leaders. Pro-
posals to attenuate the resolution
were defeated by large majorities.

APOLOGIZED FOR SHOOTING.
BELFAST, Feb. 26.
James Hughes, twenty years old, was
the victim of a fatal attack on Satur-
day night by three men, who rushed
out of a side street, and killed him in
the presence of his mother. Two men
were fired on while crossing Mill

field, a Sinn Féin section of the city.
After the shooting apologized, saying
they had mistaken their intended vic-
tims for specials.

OMINOUS FOR COALITION.
LONDON, Feb. 26.
The reverse of the Government in
the last three bye-elections are re-
garded as ominous for coalition. When-
ever a general election may be held,
it is not known when the election will
be called. Since the Irish Treaty,
revolt of the extreme Tory wing
against the leadership of Lloyd
George has grown, and unless the
Premier is able to stem this revolt,
its effect on the coalition will be seri-
ous. Victories by two Lagorites and
one Independent Liberal in the re-
cent elections were largely due to a
tacit understanding to avoid triangular
contests. Heretofore the Labor
Party has refused any compact with
the Liberals but if the Labor and Lib-
eral parties agree to an alteration of
seats, it is recognized the Government
would face a serious situation when
a general election is called. The
strength of the Labor and Liberal par-
ties in the recent elections is attrib-
uted to unemployment and bad trade
conditions.

DE VALERA'S CAMPAIGN.
BELFAST, Feb. 26.
Eamonn de Valera, continuing his
electioneering campaign, was received
last night at Ennis, County Clare,
with enthusiasm. Ennis is a Valera
constituency. He was met at the
station by uniformed Guard of Honor,
and escorted through the streets by
a procession. The town was illumina-
ted. In acknowledging the welcome
De Valera said he and his followers had
heard strange things in Dublin, one
being that eighty per cent of the Irish
people were willing to fling away the
nation's birthright.

FOUR MORE FAILURES.
NEW YORK, Feb. 27.
Saturday brought the failure of
four more Wall Street brokerage
houses, with combined liabilities es-
timated at \$200,000, and combined
assets of \$74,000. The firms were, A.
R. Smith & Co., Retz & Sullivan,
Peatley Roberts Smith, and Thomas
H. Conley & Company.

IN FAVOR OF TREATY.
DUBLIN, Feb. 27.
The Lenten Pastorals, read in
Catholic Churches throughout Ire-
land yesterday, referred approvingly
to the Anglo-Irish Treaty. The Arch-
bishop of Dublin said "for the first
time in many centuries, our people
have to a great extent the framing of
their destinies in their own hands. In
place of the unsympathetic, wasteful
and unintelligent rule of men, alien
to us in blood and traditions, we see
in process of being evolved, an Irish
Government, which have knowledge
of our people's needs. The Irish na-
tion has reached a turning point in
its existence."

POLICE BATTLE WITH STRIKERS.
JOHANNESBURG, Feb. 27.
The first fighting in connection
with the mining strike in the Rand
district occurred early to-day, when
a body of police charged two bodies
of strikers at Boksburg, using their
clubs to quell disorders. Fierce hand-
to-hand fighting ensued, in which
many casualties were suffered on
both sides.

Sisto Short of Food.
ROSALIND TO HER ASSISTANCE.
Hon. Tasker Cook received a mes-
sage this morning from the a. s. Sisto,
stating that the ship was stopped
in heavy lee and drifting E.S.E. The
Sisto gave her position as lat. 46.51
north, long. 48.05 west, and asked for
assistance. The position as given is
approximately 132 miles S.E. of St.
John's. The Rosalind, it is learned, is
now proceeding to the ship's assist-
ance and Messrs. Harvey & Co., the
Red Cross agents, received the fol-
lowing message to this effect at 8
a.m. from Capt. Mitchell: "Position
65 miles due south of Cape Race. In
field ice, making 7 knots per hour.
Sisto reports short of food; we are
proceeding towards ship to render as-
sistance."

Old Gun at Museum.
RELIC OF FRENCH OCCUPATION.
An old piece of ordnance, reminis-
cent of the days of the French occu-
pation, was removed from H.M.S.
Briton on Saturday and brought to
the Museum. The antique is a 3 inch
muzzle loading gun of about 5 feet
long. It was used by the French in
1762 in the last fight around St.
John's. The gun is mounted on the
original carriage, which has wooden
axles and wooden wheels, the latter
being brass bound. The gun was re-
