Whether the neck be too scraggy or the chin too fleshy, the throat should be sponged every morning with very cold water, and the sponging kept up for at least ten minutes. This braces the muscles and makes them firm and taut, and improves the condition of the throat considerably, The following exercises should also be practised for five of ten minutes. They will be equally beneficial to the too thin or too plump

Stand erect, hold the chin well up clench the teeth, then turn the head to the rightt, looking over the right shoulder as far as possible. Next. turn, still clenching the teeth, towards the left and look over the right shoulder as far as possible

Clench the teeth and throw the nead backwards as far as possible, looking unwards. Let the head drop on the chest: relax and repeat. These exercises are wonderfully

beneficial in restoring the contour of the throat, but they must be practised regularly.
