Parcels for abroad must have a Customs form affixed, describing nature and value of contents. Forms are supplied at Parcel Post window.

Rates to Canada and the United States, 12c. per Ib To Great Britain, 48c. for 3 fbs., over 3 and up to 7. 84c.; over 7 and up to 11 lbs., \$1.20. Parcels to Great Britain may be insured for £12 for 10c. and 10c. for each additional £12.

Parcels to places in Newfoundland are forwarded at the following rate: Half Pound, 4c.; One Pound, &c., and 3c. to each additional pound. No parcel weighing over eleven pounds can be accepted.
