It will be well to remember that the Bill passed during the last session of the Local Legislature for the registration of births, marriages and deaths in Ontario takes effect from the 1st of July next. We will summarise as briefly as possible its provisions: The Provincial Secretary is to be Registrar General of the Province. be Registrar General of the Province. The Clerk of the Peace shall be District Registrar in each County, and hip or town clerks shall be Division Registrars. The Registrar General will furnish the District Regisstrain with blank books in which the statistics are to be entered, and these officials will in turn distribute them among their subordinates, the Division Registrars. The latter have to make their returns to the District Registrars before the 16th of January of cach year. The father, mother, or guardian of a child, or (faling any of these) the owner of a house in the abirth, within thirty days, to the Division Registrar, with such further particulars as we shall hereafter enumerate, and pay ten cents. In the same manner any person person when a death occurs, shall report to the Division Registrar within thirty days after the pedical strain of twenty-five cents which he is entitled to collect from the gentlemen when he has made happy.
